ORDER PASSED BELOW EXH.1 IN CIVIL MA NO.1/2018.

(Taramati Vs. Laxman.)

- 1. Application is for condonation of delay.
- 2. Applicant submits that, RCS No.172/2007, was partly decreed on 31/10/2017. Applicant received copies on 21/12/2019 and appeal is preferred on 18/01/2018. According to applicant, there is delay of 5 days, which is unintentional. The delay occurred due to compliance of documents and legal opinion, to file an appeal.
- 3. Respondent No.1 filed say at Exh.11. It is submitted that, there is no sufficient cause to condone the delay of five days. Alternatively it is submitted that costs of Rs.5000/- be awarded.
- 4. Respondent No.2, 3, 6 to 8, though served, but failed to appear. The respondent No.5 filed say on the application and opposes the application.
- 5. Heard the learned Advocate Mr. I.V.Ranjvan, for the applicant and learned Advocate, Mr.V.R.Mote for Respondent No.1.
- 6. Following points are formulated for determination. The points alongwith findings and reasons thereto are as under.

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POINTS

FINDINGS

Whether applicant has made out sufficient cause to condone the delay of : In the affirmative. 5 days?

2 What order? : As per final order.

-REASONS-

As to points No.1:

- 7. The delay of 5 days to prefer appeal is undisputed fact. The affidavit filed by applicant No.1 Taramati Chandanshiv, speaks about the time consumed in respect of legal opinion, to prefer an appeal.
- 8. I am of the view that, this is sufficient cause to condone the delay of 5 days, by compensating reasonable costs of Rs.500/- each. Hence, I answer point No.1, in affirmative and pass following order.

ORDER.

- 1. Application is allowed.
- 2. Delay of 5 days to prefer appeal against the judgment and decree in RCS No.172/2017 dated 31/10/2017, is hereby condoned, subject to payment of costs Rs.500/-each.
- 3. Applicant to pay costs of Rs.500/- each to the respondent No.1 and 5.
- 4. After compliance, appeal be registered.
